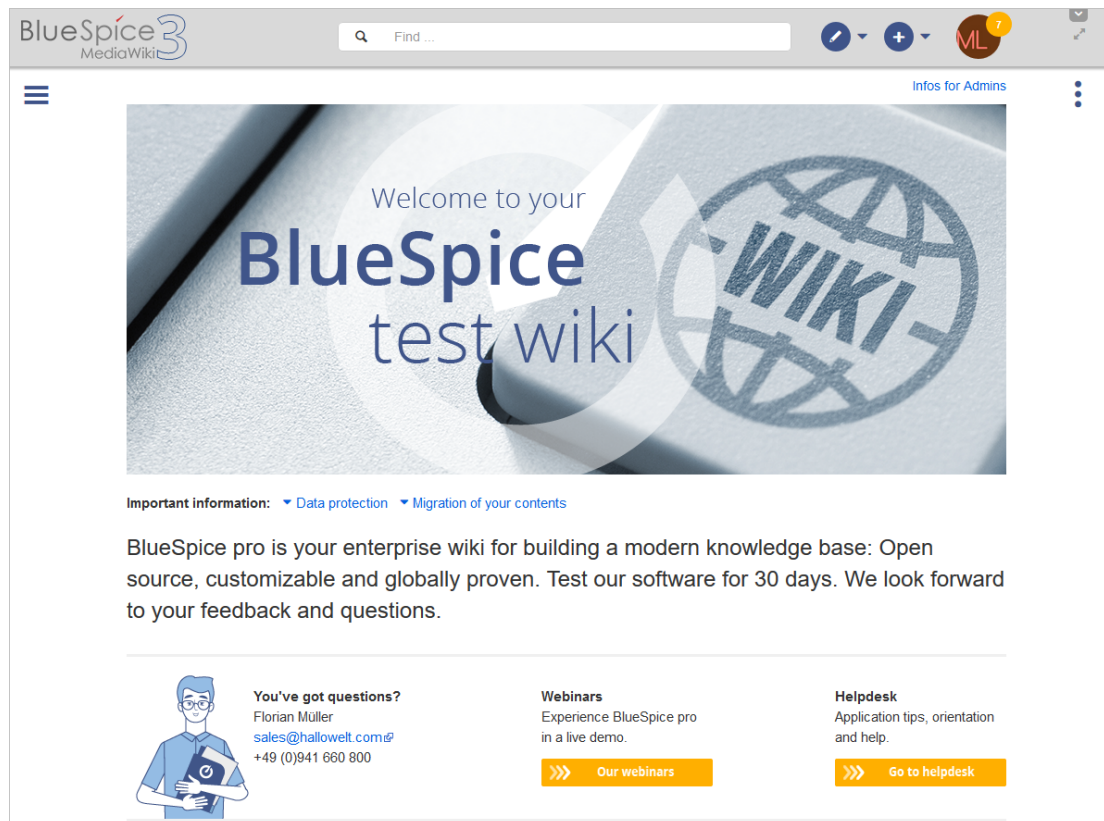

---


In some cases, it makes sense to hide the title of a page. For example, if you want to create a portal page:



## Usage

---

In [VisualEditor](#), go to *Page options > Advanced settings*:
